Online syllabus:

E-reserves:

E-reserves will be done via the Hum 110 class-wide Moodle. You and all of your students should automatically be subscribed to this Moodle. You can just follow the links from the online syllabus, log in using your Kerberos username and password and you will be able to access the PDFs directly.

We recommend that you *download the PDFs to your individual machines* before the reading is assigned to your students. In the event that your students have difficulty downloading the files, you will then be able to email them the PDFs directly.

Images:

On art days, there will be links in the syllabus to slideshows which you may want to use for discussion in your conference. These slideshows are created in the Reed Digital Collections “My Workspace” extension, developed by CIS for saving and organizing image sets for use in class. You can use these slideshow links as they are, or you can save and modify them. You may also prefer to create your own slideshow. Here are some tips for getting started:

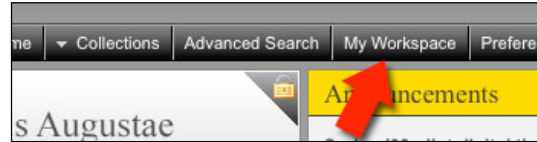
❖ Browse and search Reed’s Classics Image Database

Browse through the images in the Classics Image Database in Reed Digital Collections: <http://cdm.reed.edu/cdm4/classics> . The **Lecture** and **Topic** image

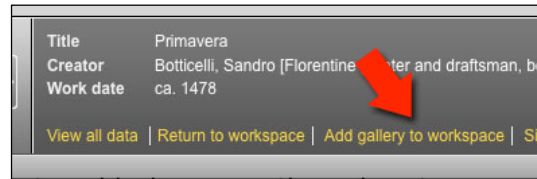
sets reflect images used in the past for Hum 110. You can also search for additional images on a particular topic.


❖ **Create your own slideshow in My Workspace**

You can save and order the images in Reed Digital Collections into your own slideshow for class using the “My Workspace” extension developed by CIS. (Log in with your Kerberos username and password.)



You can also modify an existing slideshow by logging in to your workspace, saving the slideshow and editing it.



You can generate a URL for your individual slideshow by clicking on the “Get the public link”  button in the upper right hand corner of the screen. More help is available at: http://cdm.reed.edu/cdm4/help.php#my_workspace .
